FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL

School Uniform

It is so wonderful to see the learners back in summary uniforms and enjoying the warmer weather. Unfortunately, we have noticed several instances where learners are not adhering to the Code of Conduct in relation to appearance, uniforms, hair appearance and jewellery.

We ask that you please refer to the Code of Conduct on a regular basis and, if you are still uncertain and have a question, ask for clarification from the class teacher.

Uniform inspections will be held over the course of next week and e-mails will be sent to parents should their child not be complying with the school rules.

We have set out some important reminders in today's newsletter which reiterates certain items in the Code of Conduct. We ask that you assist your children to ensure that they comply with the School Rules.

Physical Appearance

- The uniform must be clean and in good repair and learners should take pride in themselves and their appearance.
- Learners must leave the premises of our school or any other sports event in full school or sports uniform, including the school blazer.

Summer Uniform

- Boys:
 - Beige school shirt with Montrose badge on the pocket; pink-coloured shorts, long brown socks and brown school shoes, school blazer.
 - Grade 7 Boys - short sleeve white shirt; brown tie with Montrose badge; grey long trousers; school blazer; long brown socks; brown shoes.
- Girls:
 - Yellow checked dress, short white socks and brown school shoes, school blazer.

Jewellery

The following is **not** allowed:

- Ear piercings for boys.
- The wearing of earrings with dangling accessories or shiny stones. Only standard thin silver or gold 'sleepers' or studs (for those girls with pierced ears) and only in one hole.
- Earrings in a position other than the bottom/first hole.
- The wearing of any rings, 'sleepers', studs in or on the nose or any other part of the exposed skin or tongue.
- The wearing of necklaces, pendants, bangles, rings, charms, talismans, ribbons or any jewellery, except a regular wristwatch.

[CONT.]

- Under no circumstances may smart watches be used for anything other than a basic watch. Any learner who uses the phone or messaging function will have the watch confiscated until the end of the term in the same way as a cellular phone. No smart watches are allowed during any assessments and exams.
- Religious jewellery may be worn but must be kept to a minimum (1 only) and must be kept under the school uniform.
- The wearing of any make-up, nail varnish, tattoos, henna on nails or any other decorative marks made on the skin (except for religious ceremonies).

Hair Appearance

- Learners may not dye or streak their hair.
- All exotic/elaborate (i.e. any hairstyle which is not considered to be the norm; which is in any way unusual or out of the ordinary; the School Management Team reserve the right to decide on whether a hairstyle can be regarded as exotic) and trendy hairstyles are prohibited. Only simple braiding is allowed for girls.
- Boys are required to keep their hair short and neat. The fringe is not to be lower than the eyebrows and no hair to touch the ears.
- No gel or similar hair products are allowed.
- Girls may only secure their hair with the use of clips, pins, slides and other devices. Alice bands and 'scrunchies' must be either yellow or brown.
- Hair extensions the colour of the natural hair may be worn but must be tied back at all times. No highlighted extensions are allowed.

Physical Education

Only the Montrose PE shirt (yellow shirt with school badge) and Montrose shorts/skort may be worn and must be worn with white or brown socks, tekkies and the school blazer. If it is cold children may wear black or dark brown tracksuit pants (no leggings), the school blazer and the school jersey if needed. If you have school tracksuit, this may be worn, however this is not a compulsory item of the school uniform and need not be purchased specifically for Phys. Ed. No other coloured non-school garments may be worn on these days.

The pride learners feel for their school is displayed in how they wear their school uniform and present themselves. Let us ensure that our children understand the value of neatness and school pride.

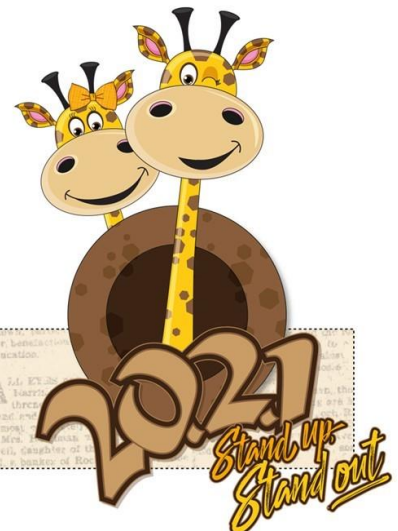
Montrose Night Challenge
